1 or 2 days/week

**Twos**, our youngest students, are starting their adventure by learning how to take turns, share, listen to the teacher, walk in a line, and make friends. They are learning to identify shapes and colors, and are beginning to learn letter names. They have lots of opportunities for sensory play and gross motor development. They play outside when the weather is good and are out of the room for daily chapel, music/PE, Spanish, and lunchtime. At the end of each busy day of fun and learning, **Twos** recover with naptime!

# Threes

2 or 3 days/week

**Threes** are learning to discover the world. They are reinforcing letter recognition and learning letter sounds. They are learning to be responsible, to make good choices and to show respect for others.

**Threes** are working hard on developing their fine motor skills with lots of hands-on activities and practice. With a full schedule including chapel, music/PE, and Spanish, they are turning the corner to becoming big kids!



## Fours

3 days/week

**Fours** are preparing to launch! These pre-k students are learning the rules that govern what sounds letters make within the context of the words, opening up a whole world of learning new things. By the end of the year, many of them will be reading! Daily schedule includes chapel, music/PE, and Spanish. They are learning that growing up means showing the way for those behind them, and that they are never too small to be a light to the world.

**Fours** are learning to become responsible students and good members of the community.

**Music & PE** is a daily part of our students' schedule. They will learn about tempo, beat, and play a variety of instruments.
